
We are learning to read the Bible


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
### The story of the Bible

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### The story *in* the Bible

Calvin did not for a moment think that every word, clause and sentence of the Bible was objectively factual, that the streets of heaven are (literally) paved with gold and that God literally has a backside. He had a Renaissance humanist's appreciation of metaphor and analogy and of the different genres of biblical writing.
