The news so far regarding my health is that I did not get onto the drug trial so it is back to the drawing board. I await news from doctors of an alternative plan

I have just returned from Qatar and South Africa and want to give thanks for a very inspirational time. Firstly I visited the church in Doha and stayed in an ex-pat community with friends from South Africa who are living and working there. Then we went onto Johannesburg and to a safari. I learnt a new Zulu craft from the locals making carvings from monkey oranges! I had a fantastic time seeing lots of big animals, rhinos, hippos, elephants etc, but I loved the warthogs.

We studied Genesis 1 on our first bible study back on 21 May. It was more meaningful having experienced so much of the Lord's wonderful creation.

Pray for peacemakers to influence communities in a godly way since the murder of the soldier in Woolwich on 22 May. Pray for us as we reach out. I spoke to a young man called Hamzu the day afterwards about the love and mercy of the Lord and that while we were still sinning, Christ died to save us. It was God's plan in advance.
